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ANNUAL REPORT OF THE CLERK OF SESSION BREMEN-BETHEL PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH FOR THE YEAR 2022

The duties of the clerk of session are spelled out in the Book of Order under Section G-3.0104. The clerk and moderator must be familiar with the contents of the Book of Order in order to assure that the church operates within the parameters of the documents and rules of the Presbyterian Church (USA) and the Presbytery of Scioto Valley.

Locally, your session held a total of 9 regular meetings. Attendance was very good with only a .037% of unexcused absences. Elder Sue Henwood and elder (and clerk) Dee Mowry had perfect attendance at all session meetings.

Moderator, Rev. Larry Hoffmann had a perfect attendance record. Elders Kerry Boyd, Mike Henwood, Cinda Keller, Corey Riley and Sally Spangler had one excused absence. Retiring Elders, whose terms expired in 2022 were Kerry Boyd, Cinda Keller, Corey Riley and Susan Seifert. The Class of '25 will be Cinda Keller, Carri McCandlish, David E. Mowry and Corey Riley. Our thanks go to the retiring members for their service to the church.

Your session operates under the committee structure with four committees, Christian Education, Mission, Operations and Service. Other (non-elder) church members may be co-opted to any committee as the need arises. The books of the Bremen-Bethel Presbyterian Church were last audited by Scioto Valley Presbytery, on September 26, 2021, at the Bremen-Bethel Presbyterian Church. All records were found to be in order and the records were passed without exceptions.

COVID 19 seems to be subsiding, however, the phone-in option is still available and is being used. Community Vacation Bible School resumed with the Calvary Church as host church and Community worship services again resumed (with sparce attendance.) Loretta Dawson has been hired to assume the role of church secretary/ financial clerk. This has worked out very well to date.

Support was offered by Bremen-Bethel to the Grace Haven House, Lighthouse, Bremen Community Food Pantry, Bremen Swimming Pool, Shriners Children's Hospitals Ohio, Bremen Elementary School breakfast program as well as the One Great Hour of Sharing and the annual Joy Offering. The church contributed over \$200.00 to the Presbyterian Disaster Fund to assist families in the Kentucky/Tennessee area who experienced major tornado damage and \$1,000.00 for the Ukraine War Relief. Many upgrades to the church building and manse were finished under the direction of the Operations Committee.

It has been a busy but productive year for your session as well as the members of Bremen-Bethel.

2022 Food Pantry

The food Pantry representatives for this year were Linda Young, Bremen United Methodist, Mary Shumaker, St. Mary Catholic, Vickie Winkleman, Calvary United Methodist, Joyce Mohler, Jerusalem Church and Judy Turner, Bremen Bethel Presbyterian Church.

During the year we had 5 open food pantries and served an average 48 families per

open pantry. This was an increase from 38 families in 2021. An open pantry is a scheduled date for clients to receive an assortment of food and taxable items. Our

community has been very generous by supplying vegetables, meat, milk, bread, eggs, cheese, margarine and other food items for the open pantries. Our community has also donated items such as clothes, detergent, paper products, shampoo and soap. Our August food pantry included school supplies and book bags.

We also help families who need food at other times during the year on an as needed basis. This year we have served 27 families. In 2021 we helped 26. If a family needs our Food Pantry they should call 211, Information and Referral. 211 will contact us and we will make arrangements to help the family.

In December 2021 we prepared 58 Christmas baskets. We served 56 families in 2022.

Thanks to our congregation for being supportive to the Bremen Food Pantry.

Zeta Alpha 2022 Report

For the Presbyterian Women mission we donated \$100 worth of items to fill 2 backpacks

to be given to teenage boys who are released from Perry Multi-County Juvenile Facility.

Upon their release they either return home, where there may not be enough to support

them, or they have to find their own ways in the world. The items donated were mainly

of a hygienic nature and basic clothing. There were also a couple backpacks that were

filled by one of our members. Zeta Alpha also purchased 6, \$25 gift cards for donation

to teens who are clients of Huckleberry House in Columbus. Huck House supports young people struggling with homelessness, substance abuse, poverty and violence.

Our local donation was \$150 to Bottoms Up Diaper Bank to help single mothers provide

diapers for their children.

We meet on the 2nd Sunday of each month in the church basement 1 hour before church.

Everyone is welcomed to attend.

Beginning in January of 2022 the bags were packed with several breakfast items and snack items and sent home each Friday at the end of the school day. Students who received the bags did so with the permission of their parents by signing up through the school. When Susan and I took the program over from Kathy Mowery it was serving about 150-160 students a week. It is now serving 250 per week. We work very hard to control our cost and the last 2 years ,with the supply chain and availability of different items each week this has become a much tougher issue.

With the help of our volunteers and the support of the Church, congregation, and our friends in the community we are able to continue this program again this coming year.
