FROM THE CLERK OF SESSION: Dee Mowry



November is a very busy month for your session, busier than usual this month with the sale of the Manse. There is a buyer, and the deal is to be completed very soon. I am sure there are mixed feelings about the sale, but in the long run, it was a good decision. Presbytery has a policy about housing allowances for ministers. From the information I am receiving, ministers today are not too much interested in living in a manse. My guess is that the manse, and it was built as a manse, was built about that same time as the church, circa 1907-8, although I am not sure. The church operations committee did an OUTSTANDING job of much of the work needed at the manse in preparation for the sale. The committee consists of Corey Riley, Chair, Sue Henwood and George Shreyer.

This committee, as well as the other committees and the treasurer, are responsible for the proforma budget each year. The budget is the spending plan for the upcoming year. The session also receives the report of the nominating committee, which is made up two retiring session members, one of which will chair the committee, and three elected congregational members. The nominating committee this year consisted of Ron and Cindy Cullumber (Chair) from the session and Scott Bergreen, Gene McCandlish and Ray Schmidt, congregational representatives Paid personnel, the secretary and the custodian, are interviewed by the personnel committee, consisting of the 4 standing session committee chairs (or their reps) and your congregational representative, Judy Turner. Their job is to interview the candidates, listen to any concerns, and make a recommendation as to salaries. Rev. Hoffmann is employed by the session on a supply minister yearly basis. The mission committee is also tasked with the job of the annual review of the church roll. Some members just 'disappear' and cannot be found, some pass away, others just stop coming. This is not a very 'fun' task but is a Book of Order mandated task. In addition, there is a cost factor...(vour clerk's first degree from Ohio State was in economics and corporate finance.) As a result, I look at finances as well as other factors. Our per capita cost, which is what we pay for each member to the higher ad judicatories, is \$40.00+ per member each year!!!!!!!!

In addition to the above, year-end activities are planned to include the congregational meeting scheduled for December 10 for budget affirmation and elections and the Children's program on December 17.



Puzzle is based on Luke 2:1-20








