As of this writing, the piano tuner is hard at work tuning the piano in the sanctuary. He comes two times a year to tune and service the piano. Music is an important part of our church entity, and we are INDEED fortunate to have such a talented pianist as Ray Schmidt who fulfils this position very admirably. Music is mentioned two times in the Bible, once in Amos and once in Mark. Amos, Chapter 6, vs 4, 'Woe to those who lie on beds of ivory and stretch themselves upon their couches...Who sing idle songs to the sounds of the harp, and like David invent for themselves instruments of music;'. In Luke, Chapter 15, vs 25 (The prodigal son) 'Now his elder son was in the field; and as came...near the house he heard music and dancing'. It appears as though music was not too important at this time!!!!! We have two instruments of music in our sanctuary, the piano as mentioned above and the Hammond organ. The last time I played the organ was for Faye Hilyard's funeral. Faye had requested that I play "Ivory Palaces' at her funeral. The organ works fine and all we need is someone to play, any volunteers???????
