#### FROM THE CLERK EMERITUS: D. Dee Mowry

On my desk is a small handbook entitled The Presbyterian Handbook. It covers such subjects such as How to Survive for One Hour in an Un air-Conditioned Church, How to Welcome a Visitor, How to be a Visitor, How to Respond When Someone sits in Your Pew, How to Receive The Lord's Supper.

This section is appropriate as we celebrate Communion the first Sunday of the month. The Book of Order states that communion shall be observed at least once a quarter. Communion also known as the Eucharist which confirms the idea of a "New Covenant" as the people who have received Jesus Christ. It is a remembrance of the death and resurrection of Jesus and a celebration of the reign of God and the return of Jesus.

The 'elements' of the Lord's Supper are bread and wine. The bread may be a loaf of bread or individual pieces, and the 'wine' is usually grape juice which may be served in a common cup or individual glasses. (As a recovering biology professor....forget the common cup!!!!!!!) In this church, as common in many Presbyterian Churches, Communion is served by the elders, while the congregates remain in the pew. In some churches the congregation proceeds to the front of the church and receives the elements from the pastor or elder with bread and wine received separately or the bread may be dipped in the wine (called intinction').

Who may receive communion? In the Presbyterian church, all are invited who have faith in Jesus Christ and have been baptized.


